"Development of guidelines for developing green industrial zones along the New Silk Road"

March 11, 2013:

The 1st project preparatory meeting was held with participants from UNIDO/RO, CICETE and UCSSIC. Discussions were held on the setting-up of project Steering Committee and Expert Advisory Group as well as visiting Republic of Korea for the Global Green Growth Summit and establishing ties with potential cooperating partners.

March 18, 2013:

The 1st Project Steering Committee was held at the UNIDO office in Beijing with participants from UNIDO/RO, UCSSIC, CICETE/MOFCOM, National Development and Reform Commission (NDRC), Ministry of Industry and Information and Ministry of Environmental Protection. Future work plan was laid out on such issues as working methods of the Steering Committee, the Secretariat and the Expert Advisory Group.

In the following 3 months, case-studies of green industrial parks/zones will be carried out in China and a study tour visit to Republic of Korea will be organized to attend the Global Green Growth Summit in Seoul, followed by on-site visit to some green industrial parks in the ROK.

April-May, 2013

Via UNIDO/HQ, the project Secretariat received a formal invitation from the Global Green Growth Institute to attend the Global Green Growth Summit 2013 in Seoul during June 10-11. In collaboration with CICETE, UCSSIC organized a 10-member delegation to attend the GGGS and 3-day field visit to local industrial parks and partners.

June 10-11, 2013

The 10-member delegation composed of UNIDO staffs, government officials, experts/consultants and representatives from industrial park attended the Global Green Growth Summit 2013 in Incheon.

June 12-14, 2013

Study visit to techno parks and Korean partner organizations. The visit was one of the implementation



activities under the "Green Silk Road Project" supported by UNIDO to promote sustainable green industrial growth along the New Silk Road and international cooperation. The GGGS attracted more than 500 participants from both developed and developing countries around the world and touched upon extensively on such topics like "financing green growth plans" and "measuring progress and financing future plans" on various lines of business. The study visit brought the delegation to some Korean partners including the GGCI, Songdao Techno Park, GTC-K and KEMCO.
